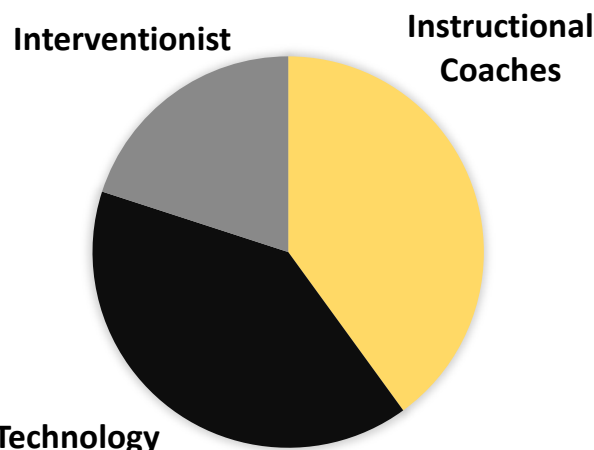

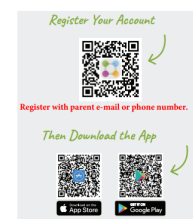
FUNDING
